

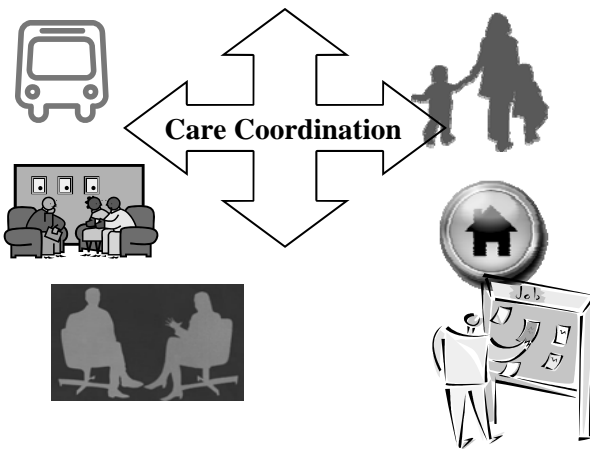
Participant Eligibility Requirements

- Discharging from a publically-funded residential treatment program to a community in Maryland.
- Meets income requirements (check with counselor)
- Willing to continue treatment in an outpatient program.
- In need of recovery support service:

Housing ■ Job Readiness ■ Childcare

Family Counseling ■ Pastoral Counseling

Transportation ■ Care Coordination

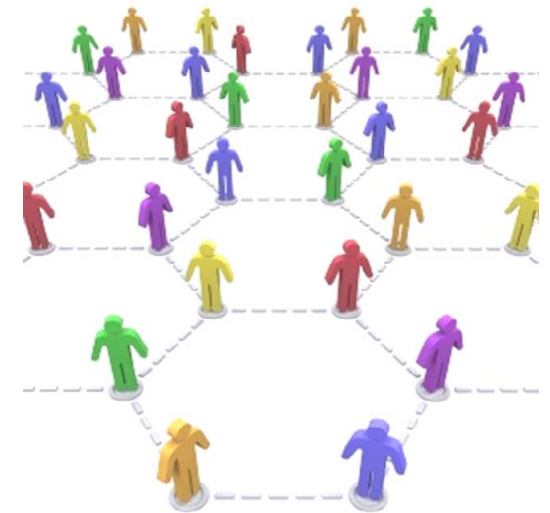

Participant Information

“Building a network of services in support of community-based recovery.”

What is *RecoveryNet*?

Maryland RecoveryNet is a federally-funded program that provides clients with access to services that can help them break free from their use of alcohol and other drugs and establish a healthy sober life in their community.

Services include traditional clinical treatment services, as well as alternative recovery support services that have not been traditionally funded in the past that are paid for with vouchers given to the participant and redeemed by participating recovery support service providers.

Clinical Services offered include:

- Halfway house
- Family/couples counseling
- Pastoral counseling

And **recovery support services** offered include:

- Recovery Housing
- Job Readiness Training
- Childcare
- Transportation
- Care Coordination *(required for all participants and assigned at admission to the RecoveryNet Program)*

Note: Service availability may be limited in some regions, counties or localities.



How is RecoveryNet different from other programs?

- Genuine, free, and independent choice of a provider that will best meet their recovery needs from the RecoveryNet Provider Directory.
- Offers an array of providers that include licensed clinical treatment agencies as well as grassroots, community, and faith-based organizations that offer the service that you need to support your recovery.
- A Care Coordinator is assigned to each participant.

What is Care Coordination?

A Care Coordinator is assigned to you to assist you in transitioning your recovery to your community. They will help you access the support services that you need and keep in touch to assist you with managing your vouchers and stabilizing your recovery. Care Coordinators will also arrange for you your discharge and 6 month follow-up GPRA survey interviews.

What do I have to do to participate in RecoveryNet?

1. Talk with your residential treatment program counselor about your interest and eligibility.
2. Agree to complete **three Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA) Surveys**. (This survey takes about 30 minutes is given first, by your counselor when you are admitted to the RecoveryNet Program, and then by your designated Care Coordinator as a 6 month follow-up and at discharge from RecoveryNet. The information is de-identified and sent to a federal database for research purposes.)
3. Agree to continue treatment through an out-patient substance abuse treatment-provider in your community. (Your counselor and Care Coordinator will assist you with this process.)
4. Maintain contact with your Care Coordinator either in person or by telephone (about twice a month) while a RecoveryNet participant.
