

## Admission guidelines for PAC patients and programs in HSCRC-regulated space

1. PAC-enrolled patients in treatment as of 1/1/10	Continue in treatment in BSAS grant slot through FY 2011 if needed	Continue in BSAS grant slot until treatment episode completed*	Continue in BSAS grant slot until transferred to primary care*
2. PAC-enrolled patients seeking treatment after 1/1/10	Admit to treatment in BSAS grant slot which can continue through FY2011 if needed	Do not admit and refer to community-based program	Do not admit and refer to community-based program
